Arrival

Driving Directions – Please bring written directions, as cell phone service & GPS is spotty around camp.

From Route US 33 – south of Lancaster & north of Logan. Watch for signs and follow them to Clear Creek Metro Park. From US 33, turn west onto County Road 116, AKA Clear Creek Rd. There is a Sunoco Station on the corner. Follow Clear Creek Rd. about 2 miles until you see a Metro Park parking lot on your left. Turn left on the road just past the parking lot (Camp Wyandot sign) and cross the bridge. Immediately following the bridge, turn left into camp. This road into camp is one car wide, with poor visibility. Before entering the road, honk your horn and pause to see if any other cars are coming. Proceed along the road to the open flat area to park. After you've parked, continue walking up the road; the dining/dance hall is the first building on the right.

Musicians may drive up the to dining hall to drop of instruments, before parking at the Flats area.

People staying in cabins may drive up the access road to drop off supplies, before parking at the Flats area.

What to Bring

1. **Driving Directions**
2. **Sturdy Walking Shoes:** The camp has gravel roads and trails that go up and down.
3. **Flashlight:** Even if you're not staying overnight, the walk back to your car may be dark.
4. **Potluck Food:** There are refrigerators, plenty of plugs for slow cookers, and a microwave. We will NOT be able to use the stove or oven for potluck preparations. There will be bowls and utensils for last minutes cutting and mixing.

Reduce Waste

Let's make this a ZERO WASTE event. Bring your own water bottle and name button. You can refill your water bottle at our dance venue. Bring your potluck contribution in a reusable container. If you're a coffee drinker, bring a travel mug.

Staying Overnight

Attendees have a choice of staying in the rustic cabins at Camp Wyandot or pitching your own tent at the camp. People who plan to use tents, do have the option of switching to a cabin if there is wet weather.

Cabins

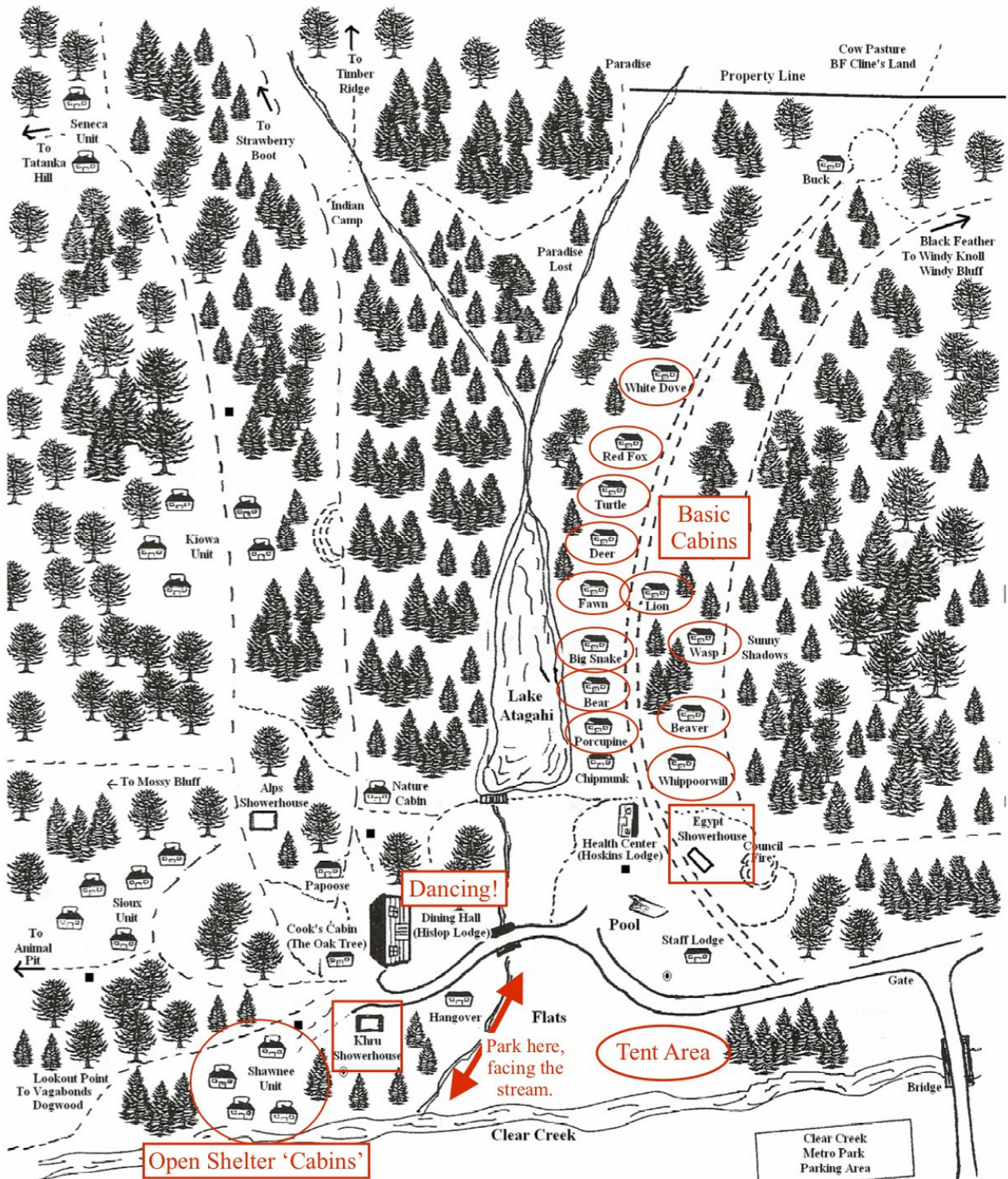
Bathroom facilities are available outside of the cabins. There is no electricity or water in the cabins. The cabins provide beds with camp mattresses - the cabins are not heated. Please bring weather appropriate bedding/sleeping bags and pillows. Attendees will choose their own cabins when you arrive – there will be a Women Only Cabin (Porcupine – see map) and a Men Only Cabin (Big Snake – see map), all other cabins are not designated.

Tents

Tents may be pitched in the Flats area, near the Clear Creek and grove of trees. If you have any questions about pitching tents, please talk to Adriane or Ellie.

Recreational vehicles can be parked near the staff lodge, check-in with Adriane or Ellie with any questions.
